- Free tutoring and standardized test preparation utilizing test prep software and individual instruction
- Free advice and counseling from program staff in areas of academic curriculum, career choice, financial aid, and college admissions
- Free student leadership seminars and college/university campus visits
- Free workshops and summer enrichment that focus on community service, cultural and academic skills enhancement
- Free access to PSAT/SAT/ACT college fee waivers for eligible participants


Our Mission

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

Educational Talent Search (ETS) targets first generation and/or low income middle, junior high, high school, and out of school participants via contacts with school administrators, counselors, teachers, community liaisons, and referrals. Participants can be enrolled upon completion of the fifth grade and will complete a mandatory interview and needs assessment prior to participation.
