HEOA Background

About HEOA

- The Higher Education Act of 1965 (HEA), as amended by the Higher Education Opportunity Act of 2008 (HEOA), includes many disclosure and reporting requirements.
 - "A disclosure requirement is information that a postsecondary education institution is required to distribute or make available to another party, such as students or employees."

HEOA compliance is not optional.










Guiding Resource

Issues with Consumer Information

- Prior to HEOA guidance from NPEC:
 - Institutional information was difficult to locate on websites.
 - Definitions, collection processes, and distribution of information varied.
 - Information was difficult to compare across institutions.

Purpose

 The purpose of this presentation is to provide institutions with a tool to simplify the process of meeting HEOA disclosure standards.









NPEC Disclosure Suggestions

- Focus both on compliance and communication.
- Develop a single web page on the institution's website that provides hyperlinks to the HEOA disclosure information.

NPEC Disclosure Suggestions

- Adopt a "3-click" approach.
- Use consumer-friendly labels and language whenever possible, and avoid institutional/technical jargon.
- Use a common set of content titles.



Disclosure Methods

- Information is distributed in a variety of methods, including:
 - Distributed to relevant parties
 - Made available through appropriate publications, mailings, or electronic media
 - Provided upon request
 - Open for public inspection
 - Provided to general public
 - Published on website








Implementation of HEOA Web Site

Implementation Issues

- Issues experienced:
 - Similar to those indicated by NPEC:
 - Unable to locate information on institutional websites
 - Pieces of information belong to different departments
 - Information not gathered or disseminated
 - Variance in terms and definitions
 - Lack of ownership









Development of a HEOA Process

- Review of consumer websites for reference
- Locate relevant institutional resources to meet HEOA needs
- Determine items that are not available and need to be collected
- Create checklist of all HEOA items for tracking










Development of HEOA Checklist

- To resolve the issues encountered:
 - Created a checklist which:
 - Categorizes information
 - Provides links to definitions
 - Indicates distribution method
 - Indicates responsibility
 - Provides links to online information
 - Provides links to archived files
 - Indicates confirmation of completion

Implementation of Checklist

- Checklist template implemented by three institutions:
 - Macon State College
 - Valdosta State University
 - Wake Forest University









Macon State College

- Founded in 1968
- Located in Macon, GA (1 hour south of Atlanta)
- Schools:

Arts and Sciences, Business, Education, Information Technology,

and Nursing & Health Sciences

Fall 2010 enrollment – 6,232

Student/faculty ratio – 22/1









HEOA - Macon State College

- No one assumed responsibility initially
- Institutional Research & Planning took the lead on organization – NOT COMPLIANCE, itself
- Visited with the appropriate offices to determine current compliance or what was needed










HEOA - Macon State College

- Working through the challenges of the process
 - Time
 - Definitions
 - Process for ensuring accurate information
- Created a HEOA Compliance web site to display all components in one location









Valdosta State University

- Founded in 1906
- Located in South Georgia
- Schools:
 - Arts, Arts and Sciences, Business, Education, Nursing, and Graduate
- Fall 2010 enrollment 12,898
 - Undergraduate 10,794
 - Graduate 2,104
- Student/faculty ratio 22/1









HEOA - Valdosta State University

- One office organizes the process
 - Strategic Research & Analysis took first pass on assignment of information
- Similar to assessment content experts need to verify information
 - Meet with respective VPs to review each item









HEOA - Valdosta State University

- If we don't understand the information, others won't either.
- Link to live pages to make updates easy.
 - Be sure to check links occasionally.
- Archive all active data and links at least once a year.













- Founded in 1834
- Schools
 - Arts and Sciences, Business, Divinity, Graduate, Law, and Medicine
- Total FTE enrollment 7,071
 - Undergraduate 4,621
- 6 year graduation rate 90%
- Student/faculty ratio 11/1
- SAT/ACT optional in 2009







HEOA - Wake Forest University

- Financial Aid Office took lead initially
 - Largest stake holder
- Office of Compliance now coordinates all
 - Located at medical school campus
 - Meetings with responsible offices
 - Spreadsheet of activities by responsible offices and dates









HEOA - Wake Forest University

- Consumer information web site developed
 - http://www.wfu.edu/administration/ consumer-info/
 - Challenges for updating site
 - Broken links
 - Meeting to change ownership from University Web Master to Compliance Office
 - Goal to display prominently completed web site at university home page


