What were your favorite classes while in the MLIS program?

It would be a tossup between the Preservation and Genealogy courses. My background is in archives and I love the different aspects of the field, at the same time, one of my favorite hobbies is genealogy, so getting to research and earn class credits at the same time was great.

What was your favorite course project while receiving your MLIS degree?
