# DEPARTMENT OF MODERN AND CLASSICAL LANGUAGES VALDOSTA STATE UNIVERSITY FOR CERTIFICATION-ONLY NON-DEGREE GRADUATE STUDENTS

This program is designed for candidates who wish to obtain teacher certification in French. It is not a degree program. The candidate who completes the requirements of this program will be eligible to teach French at the pre-kindergarten through twelfth grade level of instruction.

Upon admission to the Certification Program in French, a candidate's previous completed course work will be evaluated in comparison with the stated requirements of the program. Professional development activities, relevant work experience, or similar courses may satisfy some of the requirements. The review will be based on documentation, such as college transcripts, certificates and/or other proof of professional development or work experiences, which the candidate will provide.

Based on the results of the review, an individualized program of study leading to eligibility for certification will be developed. The plan is valid for three years, and the writer of the certification plan will be the candidate's advisor until the completion of the program. The candidate and the advisor will work together to provide a schedule for the completion of all requirements.
