Competition Division Descriptions

To encourage maximum participation, there are three divisions for Homecoming teams each year: the Flame Division for Student Organizations and Groups of Students, the Bonfire Division for Social Greek lettered organizations, and the Inferno Division for Housing & Residence Life.

The Flame Division (RSOs & Groups of Students)

1. Any 1 or more student organizations (up to three) or affiliated group of students (i.e.- a leadership role group, a class, a cohort, a VSU program, leader team) are welcome to participate in the Flame Division as pairings. Flame Division participants must compete in at least 4 of the Flame Division of the Spirit Contests.
2. Any team competing in the Flame Division will not be allowed to compete in any other division for points.
3. This division will compete for The Flame Cup and the winner will be announced and presented the Cup at halftime of the Homecoming Game on October 19. Second and third place will also be announced.
4. The Flame Cup will be awarded to the organization that accrues the most Spirit points over the course of the week's competitions. These are allocated based on the number of events that each group participates in.
5. Flame Division has an "Open Pairings" rule, meaning organizations may pair up with whatever groups they want.

The Bonfire Division (Social Greek lettered Organizations)

1. The Bonfire Division is only open to Social Greek Organizations, they must be a part of CPC, IFC, NPHC or MGC.
2. Bonfire Division participants must compete in at least 4 of the activities.
3. Bonfire Division has an "Closed Pairings" rule, meaning organizations are paired up through the Fraternity & Sorority Life Office.
4. The Bonfire Division will compete for the Bonfire Trophy. The winner will be announced and presented with the Bonfire Trophy at the Homecoming Game on October 19. The 2nd and 3rd place winner will be announced.
5. Any organization/group competing in the Bonfire Division will not be allowed to compete in any other division for points.
6. The Bonfire Trophy will be awarded to the team that accrues the most Spirit points over the course of the week's competitions. These are allocated based participation and placement in events.

7. 50 PTs will be given to the groups who host two (2) hangout events with their team before the start of Homecoming.

The Inferno Division (Housing & Residence Life)

1. The Inferno Division is only open to Housing Halls. Inferno Division participants must compete in at least 4 of the activities.
2. Any Hall competing in the Inferno Division will not be allowed to compete in the Flame Division or Bonfire Division for points.
3. This division will compete for The Inferno Cup and the winner will be announced and presented the Cup at halftime of the Homecoming Game on the 19th. The 2nd and 3rd place winner will be announced.
4. The Inferno Cup will be awarded to the Hall that accrues the most Spirit points over the course of the week's competitions. These are allocated based on the number of events that each group participates in.

There are new or clarified rules each year, so please read the event guidelines thoroughly.

Competitors will be provided with the judging criteria for their events which are listed below. These criteria will also be given out at the Mandatory Captains Meeting.

6. Complete all the related forms for the activities in which your organization or hall will participate.
7. Submit registration into Blazerlink no later than Friday, October 11th at 11:59pm. Late registration will not be accepted. No exceptions!
8. Place an order for your homecoming t-shirt.

Infractions or Incident of Concern Reporting

For any questions regarding the Homecoming Handbook, or to report a rule infraction or incident of concern, please submit the **Infraction/Concern Form** to the Homecoming Steering Committee at homecoming@valdosta.edu order for an infraction or incident of concern to be investigated, concrete proof must be submitted. Photos or some other form of support of your claim are required as proof. Submissions that are found to have been fabricated will be penalized and could result in disqualification of your team.

The penalties are as follows:

1 st Rule Infraction/Concern Violation	-10 points
2 nd Rule Infraction/Concern Violation	-30 points
3 rd + Rule Infraction/Concern Violation	-75 points
Penalty for leaving posters, decorations, props, or any team identifying items at events	-5 points per poster/decoration
Disregard Penalty- anyone who violates a rule or guideline after being given warning either verbally or written or anyone deemed to be proven to blatantly disregard a rule or regulation for their own benefit or team.	-150 Points

Administrative Points Penalty- levied by an administrator due to endangering others or anything deemed not in keeping with The Blazer Creed.	-100 points or more
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*** Disqualification or Point Deductions:** Guidelines regarding disqualification/point deductions can be found in rules for each specific event or can be levied on an organization as a result of cumulative infractions/violations or at the recommendation of the Homecoming Steering Committee or Student Life.

Participant Conduct Policy

It is the intention of the 2024 Homecoming Steering Committee to conduct a safe and enjoyable week of activities for all participants, students, and alumni. To ensure that all involved parties are treated with honor, respect, and dignity, the following Participant Conduct Policy will be strictly enforced starting Monday October 7th through Saturday, October 19, 2024. Please note that the conduct policy is also extended for any event/program where official activities begin prior to the start of Homecoming week.

Competition Participants:

1. Participants will be expected to refrain from profane, offensive, or divisive language during, prior to, and after competitions.
2. Participants will not engage in any altercations but will instead report any issues or disturbances to event security or event staff.
3. Any participants who appear to be intoxicated during the competitions will be removed from the event and potentially, the team will be disqualified.
4. Participants will be free from coercion as it relates to voting, competition, or any other aspects of the homecoming experience.
5. The Homecoming Steering Committee or a Staff Member of Student Life has the jurisdiction to remove any participant who violates one of these rules or any violation of the VSU Student Code of Conduct, the Blazer Creed or disqualify any team.

Competition Spectators:

1. Spectators will support their team or organization with positive encouragement.

2. Spectators will be expected to refrain from profane, offensive, or divisive language during, prior to, and after competitions.
3. Spectators will not engage in any altercations but will instead report any issues or disturbances to event security.
4. Spectators will abide by the Valdosta State University policy on alcohol consumption.
5. Spectators will remove any and all posters and decorations or props at the end of a competition. Posters, decorations, props, or any team identifying items left behind will result in a warning, and then a point deduction of 5 Spirit points per article.
6. The Homecoming Steering Committee or a Staff Member of Student Life has the jurisdiction to remove any spectators who violates one of these rules or any violation of the VSU Student Code of Conduct, the Blazer Creed or disqualify any team.

Apply for: Class Prince and Princess, King and Queen

The King and Queen candidates will be competing for Mr. & Mrs. “insert category here” before competing for Homecoming King and Queen. Each category (Bonfire, Flame, & Inferno) will crown the winner for their respective category. These winners will be announced at the Pep Rally. The winners from those categories will then compete for Homecoming King and Queen. These winners will be announced at the Homecoming Football Game Half-time show.

All applicants will participate in an interview process. A maximum of 10 king and 10 queen candidates will be chosen to continue as members of the Homecoming Court. A maximum of 3 prince and 3 princess candidates will be chosen for each class to continue as members of the Homecoming Court.

Eligibility Guidelines:

1. Must be certified by the Homecoming Committee
2. All contestants must be sponsored by a VSU registered student organization (in good standing), or one representative may be chosen from each residence hall (not each floor). Each organization/hall is allowed only one (1) entry for each court member. (I.e., one for King, one for Queen, one for Sophomore Prince and one for Sophomore Princess.)
3. Be a fulltime VSU Student attending the Fall semester of 2024
 - King & Queen must be enrolled in at least 12 credit hours for undergraduate students and at least 9 credit hours for graduate students and have completed at least 90 hours for undergraduate students.
 - Junior Prince & Princess must be enrolled in at least 12 credit hours and have completed between 60-89 credit hours.
 - Sophomore Prince & Princess must be enrolled in at least 12 credit hours and have completed between 30-59 credit hours.
 - Freshman Prince & Princess must be enrolled in at least 12 credit hours and have completed under 29 credit hours.
- All applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or greater (unless a freshman Prince or Princess who has not completed a semester at VSU).
- Organizations will not be allowed to pair up for homecoming king/queen or princes/princess nominations. Each organization or hall must submit its own choice for a homecoming king/queen or princes/princess candidate.

Required Meetings/Events:

- Interviews (one slot time): Sign up will be sent out to the applicants.
- Pre-Campaign Meeting: **Please be on the lookout for an email with more information.**
- All candidates must attend each event for at least an hour unless there is an academic or special circumstance that would be approved on a case-by-case basis by the Homecoming Steering Committee.
 - Midnight Madness
 - Casino Night
 - Pep rally
 - The Homecoming Court will be introduced during the Pep Rally.
 - Fired up Friday
 - Homecoming Game
 - Special seating on the home side (east) 30-yard line will be provided for you and your family members. However, all non-student guests

will be responsible for the purchase of their own game tickets. The dress code will be semi-formal.

- Promotion of Homecoming Events
 - Official candidates will need to stay tuned for an email about being on campus with the Fire Pit to promo the upcoming Homecoming events.

All candidates may begin campaigning once contacted by the Office of Student Life. Everyone is required to follow Appendix 1 campaigning rules and regulations or be immediately disqualified.

Rules:

1. Blazer Billboard designs and Valdosta State Trademarks should not be used in conjunction with: alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, illegal and recreational drugs & drug paraphernalia, gambling products, firearms or other weapons, profanity, sexual acts & sexually oriented goods, statements impugning other universities, racist, hateful, demeaning or degrading language or statements.

2. All billboards must incorporate the theme, Blazer Hoedown Throwdown
3. Blazer Billboards will be judged by peers at the pep rally on Thursday October 17th.
4. Members of your organization and/or hall must draw, paint, and/ or decorate the Blazer Billboards. See Appendix 2 for more information.
5. The Blazer Billboards must be finished and brought to the Complex by 4pm on Thursday October 17th, to be judged.

Rules:

1. Organizations can only use the blocked off area to create their designs. One sidewalk section per team. Please leave enough space between each exhibit so that all participants will have free room to work.

2. Sidewalk chalk designs and Valdosta State Trademarks should not be used in conjunction with: alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, illegal and recreational drugs & drug paraphernalia, gambling products, firearms or other weapons, profanity, sexual acts & sexually oriented goods, statements impugning other universities, racist, hateful, demeaning or degrading language or statements.
3. Members of your organization or hall must draw the sidewalk displays.
4. ONLY washable materials may be used (chalk, charcoal, etc.)
5. Automatic disqualification will ensue if it is discovered permanent materials have been used such as paint, hairspray or any other materials.
6. The displays must be finished and ready to be judged by Wednesday, October 16th at 4:00pm. Any display not completed by 4:00 pm will not be judged.
7. Any organization found starting before 12:01 AM will be disqualified.

Appendix 1

1. All campaigning and/or campaigning materials must be purchased by the individual.
2. Ads in the student newspaper (The Spectator) and other campus media may not be purchased with monies from student fees that are allocated to specific organizations and/or departments but may be purchased with other funds.

3. Candidates can only be sponsored by one (1) organization. Even if a candidate is a part of multiple organizations, they can only have one sponsor.
4. Candidates can only put one organization logo on their marketing.
5. Campaign posters shall be hung only on bulletin boards and other approved sites.
6. No campaign posters or signs may be placed on the doors, walls, windows, glass, or organic surfaces in any campus buildings.
7. Please consult the person or persons responsible for the location of the desired posting for other rules or restrictions for that location.
8. No cellophane-type tape or other materials that may cause permanent damage may be used to hang or secure campaign materials.
9. Tags may be worn by the candidate (“Hello, I’m Jane Doe”) as a source of identification only.
10. Sashes must be worn to all campus events related to Homecoming.
11. Organizations cannot pay for any campaign materials for their candidate.
12. No platforms are allowed to be posted, talked about or shared.
13. At official events every member of the Court must wear their “Homecoming Court” sash.
14. **All sheet signs must be approved by the Office of Student Life, and all posting policies must be adhered to.**
 - a. Select the Homecoming Steering Committee in the “Your Organization” drop down menu.
15. Every candidate has until Friday, October 18 by 5:00 PM to remove all campaign materials. If they are not removed by the deadline the candidate will be disqualified.
16. Please address all questions before you and/or your sponsoring group begins campaigning to ensure that all rules are followed to avoid disqualification. If any of these rules are broken, the candidate will be disqualified immediately.
17. Funding Amount:
 - a. Candidates can spend up to \$500 on items for their campaign
 - b. Candidates can get up to \$300 worth of items or services that are donated by a company.
 - c. All items need to have receipts or item value that are turned in on Friday, October 18 by 4:00 PM to homecoming@valdosta.edu.

If any of these rules are broken, the candidate will be disqualified immediately.

Homecoming Elections

- The 2024 Homecoming Court will be chosen by a campus-wide election. Voting will take place on Blazerlink. The first election for King & Queen will take place on October 16, 2024 from 1:00 AM to 11:59 PM to pick the top five candidates. The election results will be announced at the Pep Rally and posted on social media (@VSUHomecoming).

- The second election will be held on Thursday, October 17, 2024 from 9:00 PM to 2:00PM to select the official King & Queen. The 2024 Homecoming King & Queen will be announced during the halftime show at the Homecoming Game on Saturday, October 19th.
- The election for Class Prince & Princesses will take place on October 16 2024, from 1:00 AM to 11:59 PM to pick the winners for each Class Prince & Princess. The winners will be crowned at the Homecoming Pep Rally.

Appendix 2

The following policy is designed to allow registered, in good standing, student organizations, administrative and academic departments, and individual employees to properly post sheet signs and banners on the VSU campus in a manner consistent with the mission of the University.

All billboards, banners, and sheet signs to be displayed on the VSU campus must be approved by the Office of Student Life (Student Union, 229-333-5674). Banners/sheet signs must be sponsored by a VSU department or registered organization

1. To be hung in front of the Student Union must have additional approval by the Office of Student Life (Student Union, 333-5674)
2. To be hung on VSU shuttle buses must be approved by the Parking & Transportation Office (Sustella Parking Deck, 293-PARK.).
3. May be hung from trees (but not Pine Trees or trees surrounding the Student Union). No Banners or Sheet Signs may be hung from or attached to buildings, fences, lampposts, or walls.
4. Can be displayed up to ten (10) days before the event and both the Banner/Sheet Sign and the Rope or Twine must be removed by the sponsoring organization or individual within one day after the event. In special circumstances, approval may be granted for longer display periods. Materials for creating or hanging sheet signs/banners are not provided by the Office of Student Life.
 - a. Must include the Name of the VSU sponsoring organization(s), department(s), or individual(s);
 - b. the Date, Time, and Location of the program or event (if applicable): and
 - c. The Required Office of Student Life Approval.
5. May not be obscene or defamatory, and must not violate University, federal, state, or local laws.
6. May be hung/attached using only Twine, String or Rope and must not be attached in ways that will cause damage to trees, light posts, or other objects. All String Twine, Rope, etc. must be removed within one day after the event. May not be suspended from the walkway over Oak Street. May not be displayed in areas that will obstruct traffic or the normal use of facilities.

7. Will be approved on a first come, first served basis.
8. The Office of Student Life is not responsible for any loss of, or damage done to a banner/sheet sign posted on the VSU campus.
9. Any Banners/Sheet Signs which violate this posting policy will be removed regardless of content or sponsoring entity and disposed of by the Office of Student Life. The first time this policy is violated, a warning letter will be issued to the responsible organization or individual. Further instances of failure to comply with these regulations will result in loss of privileges for hanging sheet signs and banners on campus for the remainder of that semester, and/or loss of facilities use privileges, and/or other appropriate disciplinary measures.
10. Complaints filed against any University student, faculty, staff member, or student organization that destroys, defaces, or removes banners/sheet signs without permission will be under the jurisdiction of the University Judicial System.
11. The University reserves the right to impose reasonable restrictions and/or requirements concerning time, place, and manner of posting activities. These restrictions may be in addition to, or in lieu of, those outlined in this policy. The university reserves the right to update and amend this policy at any time.
